Borough Acquires Two Properties for Open Space

The Borough Council recently approved the purchase of adjoining residential properties at 197 Wyckoff Avenue and 9 Brady Street (Lots 6.02 & 6.08 in Block 136). The lots comprise 2.84 acres. The land will become parkland with potential ancillary uses for the benefit of the residents of the Borough of Waldwick. The specific future use of this land is still under discussion.



NexTrex Recycling Program Earns Trex Benches

Waldwick residents have collected more than 2,000 lbs of Trex recyclables since 2022. These materials include plastic bags & films and certain "non-Styrofoam" packing materials. The Trex Corporation donates benches based on the volume of collected recyclables. The first two benches earned by Waldwick were installed earlier this year at the memorial area in front of the Public Safety Building.
